REVIEW & PROSPECT 回顧與展望

Hong Kong has been riding out of the storm of the COVID-19 pandemic over the past year. The Sports Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China (SF&OC), joining hands with Member Associations and collaborative organizations, have injected vitality into the community through sports for the full recovery and return of normalcy, and actively promoted local sports development and strengthened the support to athletes.



Due to the pandemic, the Hangzhou 19th Asian Games was postponed for a year but our preparation work did not come to a halt. We maintained close communication with stakeholders and made timely adjustments to the arrangements. In view of the postponement, SF&OC appointed four new Members of the Selection Committee to carry out the preparation work, including confirmation of the selection criteria and a briefing to relevant National Sports Associations on the updated arrangements.

To encourage the public to stay active during the pandemic, the Olympic Day this year was held for the first time in the form of "virtual run". Participants who completed the distance anywhere in Hong Kong could receive a gift pack, enjoying the pleasure of sports.

Strengthening the support to athletes is crucial to fostering local sports development. During the year we signed Memorandum of Understanding with The Hang Seng University of Hong Kong and The Technological and Higher Education Institute of Hong Kong respectively. It provides eligible athletes with flexible arrangements of their study programmes, allowing them to pursue diverse development opportunities in training, competition, education, and career planning.

Last but not least, we sincerely thank the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, Member Associations, our sponsors and partners for their contributions and continued support. Moving forward, we have great confidence that we can overcome any challenges with strong resilience. We also extend our best wishes to the athletes for continued breakthroughs on the world stage.

要讓本地運動蓬勃發展,對運動員的支援極為重要。我們與香港恒生大學及香港高等教育科技學院簽署合作備忘錄,為合資格運動員提供彈性的升學安排,讓他們在訓練、比賽、升學、職業生涯規劃等方面多元發展,積極協助運動員未雨綢繆。

最後,我們衷心感謝特區政府、各體育總會、商界和合作夥伴一直以來的支持,攜手渡過這段艱難時期。疫情過去,我們展望將來,無論遇到任何挑戰,都能以運動員的堅毅精神去面對。我們亦祝願香港運動員繼續突破自我,在世界舞台再創佳績,以體育凝聚社會力量!




MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE 管理架構

The Sports Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China (SF&OC) actively participates in various committees* of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and the Hong Kong Sports Institute for local sports development in facilities, coaching, athletes training and sports events. As a member of the International Olympic Committee, SF&OC also participates in a number of affiliated organizations to promote Hong Kong sports in overseas competitions and to bring Olympic Movement insights to the local sports community.

MEMBERSHIP AFFAIRS AND SUPPORT 會員事務及支援

Membership Affairs

At the Annual General Meeting on 14 December 2022, SF&OC approved the membership upgrade of the Golf Association of Hong Kong, China Limited to "Association Ordinary Member" and conferred "Observer" status to the Hong Kong China Chess Federation Limited with effect from 15 December 2022. As of 31 March 2023, SF&OC consisted of three "Individual Ordinary Members", 36 "Association Ordinary Members", 18 "Associate Members" and 29 "Observers"*.

SF&OC Incentive Awards & Junior Incentive Awards

In recognition of the outstanding performance and achievements of Hong Kong athletes in multi-sports games and World/Asian Championships, SF&OC presents cash incentives to its Member Associations each year.

In 2022, a total sum of HK\$1,377,060, including HK\$924,600 for Incentive Awards and HK\$452,460 for Junior Incentive Awards, was granted to 35 Member Associations*.

港協暨奧委會獎勵計劃及 青少年獎勵計劃

本會每年均從儲備中撥出獎金予體育總會, 以表揚香港運動員在國際綜合項目運動會和 世界/亞洲錦標賽中為香港取得優異成績。

2022年度之獎勵計劃及青少年獎勵計劃總獎金金額為港幣1,377,060元,其中獎勵計劃獎金總數為港幣924,600元,青少年獎勵計劃獎金總數為港幣924,600元,分別頒發予得獎的35個體育總會*。

Guidelines on Handling Playing of National Anthem and Raising of Regional Flag

Since November 2022, the National Anthem has been misplayed on several occasions in different international sports events. Instead of the "March of the Volunteers", a song that was subversive in nature was played. To forestall the recurrence of the misplay and mishandling of the National Anthem and the Regional Flag at international sports events, SF&OC, in consultation with the Government, held a briefing session on 24 November 2022 on the Guidelines on Handling the Playing of the National Anthem and Raising of the Regional Flag for Hong Kong Athletes and Teams Engaging in International Sports Events for Member Associations to explain the relevant instructions and measures to their office bearers and staff. Over 350 representatives from Member Associations joined the briefing session either in-person or online. Mr. Paul CHENG, Acting Commissioner for Sports of Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau, and Ms. Eugenia CHUNG, Principal Assistant Secretary of Constitutional and Mainland Affairs Bureau also attended the session.

Inclusion of "Hong Kong, China" in Registered Name

SF&OC conducted a review on the progress of using "Hong Kong, China" in the registered name of Members Associations in late 2022. It was noticed that a number of Member Associations have yet to include "Hong Kong, China" in the registered names and they were requested to complete the process before 1 July 2023. For the Member Associations that need more time to complete the process, SF&OC has granted discretion in view of individual circumstances that allowing these associations to complete the relevant process as soon as practicable. The updated registered names of Member Associations as at 31 October 2023 are listed in Annex 3.

播放國歌和升掛區旗的指引

自2022年11月起,國歌曾多次在不同的國際體育賽事中被錯誤播放。主辦方播出質人養勇軍進行曲》,而是一首具顛覆性歌曲。為防止在國際體育賽事中誤播國政時後,於2022年11月24日為轄下所會實驗行《香港運動員及隊伍參與國際體別處理播放國歌和升掛區旗的指引》(《人會對問處理播放國歌和升掛區旗的指引》(《人會對別的領域到多的相關內容和措施。與大化體育及旅遊局署理體育專員種雅之均有列席。

註冊名稱冠以「中國香港」

本會於2022年底檢視各體育總會於其註冊名稱冠以「中國香港」的進展,發現部份體育總會尚未正名,因此要求相關體育總會於2023年7月1日前完成註冊正名程序;而個別體育總會需時完成有關程序,本會已按個別情況酌情處理,容許總會在可行情況下盡快完成。附錄三載列截至2023年10月31日已完成註冊正名程序的體育總會的更新註冊名稱。

Corporate Governance Team

Corporate Governance Team (the Team) was set up in October 2020 with the mission to examine the governance level of Member Associations under SF&OC by conducting reviews of the governing documents and interviews with the Office Bearers. Based on the findings obtained from the review, a report outlining the overall performances of Member Associations with recommendations on how to enhance their governance level will be submitted to the Government for consideration. The Team is also responsible for devising a "Code of Governance" for compliance and arranging thematic seminars for Member Associations with a view to uplifting the level of governance.

By the end of March 2023, the Team has completed the review of 66 Member Associations which accounted for 86% of the targeted number. Fully committed to keeping Member Associations and relevant stakeholders abreast of the progress and findings of the review, the Team conducted the "Annual Briefing on Progress of Corporate Governance Review" on 12 May 2022. In the briefing, the overall performances and areas identified for improvements were specifically highlighted.

During the year, three thematic seminars were arranged, namely "Legislations Relevant to the Participation in Multi-Sports Games", "Competition Ordinance on Membership Criteria and Procedures" and "Sports Arbitration and Mediation" to raise their awareness of corporate governance. The seminars provided tacit knowledge on the relevant topics and were well received.

The Team is now compiling the "Code of Governance" with related guidelines and procedures for Member Associations. It aims to serve as a useful tool in providing reference for Member Associations on recommended best practice in order to relieve the pressure and workload encountered in elevating their level of governance.

機構管治小組

機構管治小組在2020年10月成立,旨在透過審視港協暨奧委會轄下體育總會(屬會)的管治文件,以及與屬會高層人員會面,檢視屬會的管治水平。小組會根據檢視所得的資料,編訂檢討報告,總結屬會在管治的整體表現,並提出建議及改善方案交予政府考慮。小組亦負責制定《機構管治手冊》及舉辦主題講座,以提升屬會的管治水平。

截至2023年3月底,小組已完成與66個屬會會面,佔總數的86%。為了讓各屬會及持份者知悉最新的檢討數據及分析結果,小組於2022年5月12日舉行了「週年體育總會機構管治檢討進度」簡報會,匯報屬會的整體表現,並特別指出在機構管治上有待改善的地方。

為進一步提升屬會的機構管治意識及水平, 小組在本年度共舉辦了三個主題講座,分別 為「體育總會參與綜合項目運動會有關法 例」、「《競爭條例》一體育總會/機構入會 條件及程序」及「體育仲裁與調解」,屬會均 踴躍參與,反應熱烈。

小組正制定《機構管治手冊》及相關程序和 指引,就實施良好管治的建議方法供各屬會 參考,以助減輕屬會在提升機構管治水平時 所面對的壓力及工作量。

SPORTS DEVELOPMENT AND MAJOR LOCAL EVENTS 體育發展及本地大型活動

65th Festival of Sport 第65屆體育節

The key message for the 65th Festival of Sport (FOS) was "Stride Forward Hand-in-Hand". In order to foster community support and promote "Sports for All", over 30 FOS events were co-organized by the National Sports Associations (NSAs) from April to August 2022. More than 115 000 members of the public took part in the various activities of the 65th FOS.

Roving Exhibition

A roving exhibition was held at three different shopping malls between June to July to introduce the FOS events and showcase various pieces of Hong Kong athletes' sport equipment and objects, including medals won by the FOS Ambassadors at major games events.

Guided Tours to Hong Kong Velodrome

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic in Hong Kong, SF&OC postponed the Awards Presentation Ceremony of the Cathay 2021 Hong Kong Sports Stars Awards (the Awards) originally scheduled for 22 February 2022 to 31 August 2022.

SF&OC received 66 nominations from 33 Member Associations for the Awards. New award categories of "Hong Kong Sports Stars Awards for Men" and "Hong Kong Sports Stars Awards for Women" were introduced, whereby five athletes were awarded in each category. One male and one female awardee with the highest votes among the winners were titled the "Cathay Best of the Best Hong Kong Sports Stars Award for Men/Women" respectively. The award categories also included "Hong Kong Sports Stars Award for Team Only Sport" and "Hong Kong Sports Stars Awards for Team Event". After deliberation from the judging panel and the votes received from the media and public, 16 winners from the four categories were decided.

Hangzhou 19th Asian Games 杭州第19屆亞洲運動會

Preparation

The 19th Asian Games (AG) was originally scheduled to take place from 10 to 25 September 2022 in Hangzhou, China. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) announced on 6 May 2022 that the Hangzhou 19th AG would be postponed to 2023. OCA subsequently confirmed on 19 July 2022 that the Hangzhou 19th AG would be held from 23 September to 8 October 2023.

Owing to the postponement of the 19th AG and the election of Board Members at SF&OC's Annual General Meeting on 14 December 2022, Mr. Edgar YANG, Honorary Secretary General of SF&OC, was appointed as the Chairperson of the 19th AG Selection Committee and four new Selection Committee Members were appointed in January 2023.

The second meeting of the Selection Committee was held in February 2023 to discuss and confirm the updated SF&OC's athletes selection criteria for the 19th AG. A briefing to NSAs was organized to explain the updated selection criteria and the NSAs were invited to express their interest to participate in the 19th AG on or before 28 February 2023.

Hong Kong Olympic Academy – Overseas Study Tour 62nd International Session for Young Olympic Ambassadors 香港奧林匹克學院 — 海外交流會議第62屆國際青年奧林匹克大使會議

The 62nd International Session for Young Olympic Ambassadors, organized by the International Olympic Academy, was held in Athens and Olympia, Greece, from 11 to 23 June 2022. With the support of HKOA, SF&OC delegated Ms. Janice POON, a retired swimmer and the Assistant Manager of Olympism Education Team of SF&OC to participate in this Session.

Led by the main topic "The Olympic Movement and Olympism in digital era" and the special topic "The promotion of physical activity via digital engagement strategies and virtual sports", 125 participants from 80 countries or regions exchanged opinions on different topics to gain a better understanding on the development of Esports and virtual sports.

The Hangzhou 19th Asian Games Drawing Contest


To deepen students' understanding of the spirit and culture of the Asian Games, and show their support for their favorite sports or athletes, OFC organized the "Hangzhou 19th Asian Games Drawing Contest", encouraging Hong Kong students aged 7-13 to draw on the theme of the Asian Games with their creativity and imagination. OFC received over 50 submissions from members of the public, and the top four drawings selected will be displayed at Hangzhou during the Games.

ATHLETES CAREER AND EDUCATION SUPPORT 運動員就業及教育支援

Signing MOU with HSUHK and THEi

To provide all-rounded education support to retired athletes, SF&OC signed MOU with The Hang Seng University of Hong Kong (HSUHK) and Technological and Higher Education Institute of Hong Kong (THEi) with the aim of offering flexible study arrangements to athletes planning to retire or those who have already retired.

Signed MOU with HSUHK to Support Dual Pathways on Education and Career Planning for Athletes

Under the partnership framework, HSUHK provides flexible study arrangements for athletes recommended by SF&OC. For each academic year, Hong Kong Athletes Career and Education Department (HKACED) can nominate a maximum of five athletes for admission to HSUHK's undergraduate or postgraduate programmes. To better accommodate athletes' training needs, as well as competition and study schedules, HSUHK will extend the study duration for athletes on a need basis and provide them with designated support in academic and career planning.

Signed MOU with THEi to Provide Progression Pathways for Retired Athletes' Transformation

HKACED can nominate athletes who have been verified by National Sports Associations to enroll in the Bachelor of Social Sciences (Honours) in Sports and Recreation Management Programme offered by THEi. HKACED will also provide scholarship, consultation and life skills training to eligible athletes for their smooth transition into the workforce. On the other hand, THEi offers more flexibility for athletes nominated by HKACED including giving priority to athletes who fulfill the entry requirements, suitably adapting the study duration to accommodate their training needs, and arranging classes flexibly to enable athletes to obtain a higher academic qualification while keeping up with their training and tournament schedules.

在合作框架下,恒大將為本會推薦的運動員 提供靈活修讀安排。香港運動員就業及 教育部(HKACED)每學年可提名最多五名合 資格運動員報讀恒大學士或碩士課程。此 外,為兼顧運動員的運動訓練、比賽及學習 需要,恒大會按需要安排延長其修讀年期, 並提供學習指導及職業生涯規劃等,協助學 生運動員確立個人發展路向。

與THEi 高科院簽署合作備忘錄 為退役運動員提供升學機會助轉型

透過合作備忘錄,HKACED可提名體育總會認可的運動員報讀THEi高科院運動及康樂管理(榮譽)社會科學學士課程,並為合資格運動員提供獎學金、教育諮詢及生活技能培訓課程等,讓他們早日適應職場。另一方面時代高科院為獲HKACED提名的運動員提供實動員、按照運動員的訓練進度調節修會無期,以及彈性安排課堂等,讓他們可以意則練和比賽日程的同時,取得更高學歷。

THEi is one of the few institutes in Hong Kong that offers a bachelor's degree related to sports injury prevention and therapy.

Kai Tak Sports Park Education Programme

Co-organized by HKACED and Kai Tak Sports Park, Cohort 2 of the "Kai Tak Sports Park Education Programme" successfully concluded in August 2022. The programme aims to enhance the competitiveness of athletes who have the interest to pursue a career in sports management industry and to expand their network. Athletes learn of the knowledge and skills in the industry through attending seminars and participating in community sports events. In addition, experts of different fields in the Kai Tak Sports Park project are introduced as mentors of the athletes. Their sharing of experience and expertise enable the athletes to further understand the work of the Sports Park. The programme also comes with internship opportunities for athletes with outstanding performance to participate in the preparatory work of the opening of the Kai Tak Sports Park.



Sports Legacy Scheme「奧夢成真計劃」

Sports Legacy Company Limited (SLCL), being the HKACED's employment and professional training platform, promotes sportsmanship and athletic spirit in schools with fewer resources on sports development, and helps athletes planning to retire or those who have retired to develop their own coaching careers.

Jockey Club "Flying High" Sports Programme

The second phase (September 2021 to August 2024) of the Jockey Club "Flying High" Sports Programme – Olympic Journey, was launched with a donation from the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust. The Programme, which will be implemented in 90 secondary schools, aims to promote Olympic values through sports-related

games, identify students' sports talent, improve their understanding of the sports industry, and encourage them to join the industry through sports career-oriented activities.

The programme reached 30 secondary schools and over 13 400 students through the engagement of 46 coaches in 2021-2022 school year.

With the ongoing support of strategic partners and sponsors, Lee Hysan Foundation and Chow Tai Fook Charity Foundation, SLCL continued to implement the Go Play Olympics! Programme in primary schools in 2021-2022 school year. Fitness and sports activities were carried out for primary school students to share the joy of sports and promote students' physical and mental development. The Programme, spanning across four years from September 2018 to August 2022, was implemented in 35 schools and benefited around 15 000 students.

Effective from 1 April 2023, the Hong Kong Athletes Career & Education Programme was officially renamed to the "Hong Kong Athletes Career & Education Department", to provide more comprehensive support to athletes.

ANTI-DOPING TESTING AND EDUCATION 運動禁藥管制檢測及教育

Testing Programme

As at 31 March 2023, the Hong Kong Anti-Doping Committee (HKADC) Testing Pools included a total of 300 elite athletes from 33 sports. During the reporting period, HKADC conducted a total of 380 out-of-competition tests, 75 of which were performed overseas; and 15 in-competition tests at four local events. Furthermore, 15 in-competition tests were carried out at three international and local events under paid service agreement. Two instances of anti-doping rules violation, involving a contract bridge athlete and an athletics athlete being tested positive, were found. The contract bridge athlete and the athletics athlete were sanctioned for 8 months and 24 months of ineligibility respectively.

Education Programme

During the year, HKADC conducted 17 anti-doping talks, one anti-doping talk for athletes returning from sanction and six outreach programmes for Member Associations and other related organizations that involved a total of over 4 800 athletes and relevant individuals. In addition, HKADC organized 11 education talks for over 2 200 secondary school students and teachers. To keep stakeholders abreast of the latest anti-doping information, in addition to regularly publishing the quarterly newsletter "TrueSelf", HKACD also designed four infographics on various important anti-doping topics. The "Fairplay Friday" series on HKADC Facebook Page was also updated monthly to promote the importance of sportsmanship and fair play by sharing Hong Kong athletes' thoughts.

藥物檢測計劃

截至2023年3月31日,共有300位來自33個運動項目的精英運動員被納入香港運動禁藥委員會(禁藥委員會)的藥檢名單。本年度內,禁藥委員會共進行了380個賽外藥物檢測,其中75個於海外進行;以及在四個本地賽事進行了15個賽內藥物檢測。此外,禁藥委員會以收費服務協議形式,為三個本地藥屬際賽事及本地賽事進行了合共15個賽動一次運動員會在本年度處理了兩宗違反運動禁藥管制規條個案,涉及的橋牌運動員及四徑運動員被驗出陽性檢測結果,因而分別被處分停賽8個月及24個月。

教育計劃

本年度內,禁藥委員會為各體育總會及有關機構舉辦了17次運動禁藥管制講座、一次違反運動禁藥管制講座及六次外展教育計劃,與共有超過4800位運動員及有關人士參方計劃,總委員會亦為超過2200位中學師生舉辦了11次教育講座。為協助持份者掌握最新的運動禁藥管制資訊,委員會除了定期出版季刊《TrueSelf》外,亦製作了四款資訊圖表,將重要的運動禁藥管制主題圖像化,同時透過每月於Facebook專頁推出「Fairplay Friday」系列分享香港運動員的想法,從而推廣體育精神及公平競賽的重要。



In accordance with the Federation's Articles of Association, except for Ms. Au Hoi Shun Stephanie and Mr. WONG Kam Po, the representative of the Athletes Committee who shall hold office whilst and for so long as he/she satisfies the conditions attaching to his/her appointment in accordance with Article 11(2), the other directors are subject to the term limits and the cycle of election in accordance with Article 11(6).

Arrangements for acquisition of shares or debentures

At no time during the year was the Federation, a party to any arrangements to enable the directors of the Federation to acquire benefits by means of the acquisition of shares in, or debentures of, the Federation or any other company.

Directors' Report

Business review

The Federation recorded a total comprehensive loss of HK\$12.9 million for the year (2022: total comprehensive loss of HK\$2.2 million) due to a loss in fair value change of financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVPL) of HK\$13 million (2022: loss of HK\$11.5 million) recorded for the year as a result of the adjustment to the global financial market, compounded by rate hikes in the financial year. The fair value loss on financial assets represented an adjustment to the book value and did not involve any cash outflow from the Federation.

The Federation has built up a positive net asset of HK\$282 million (2022: HK\$295 million) and cash balances of HK\$66.8 million (2022: HK\$67.4 million) as at the reporting date of 31 March 2023. Together with the subvention from the Government of the HKSAR and the commercial sponsorship, the Directors are of the opinion that the Federation has sufficient liquidity and financial resources to fund its principal activities.

With the lifting of the COVID-19 pandemic control measures, sports activities and programmes gradually resumed in the second half of the financial year. The Federation will remain focused on sports development, and firmly believes that all these works to be done will eventually create value for our members, athletes and the community.

With the support from the Government, the Anti-Doping Organization of Hong Kong, China Limited ("ADOHK") was incorporated to take up all the business, assets and liabilities of the Hong Kong Anti-Doping Committee ("HKADC") under the Federation on 1 April 2023. Thus, the Federation ceased to have its control over the HKADC by 31 March 2023 and will coordinate with ADOHK to preserve a doping-free environment for fair play in sports.

The Federation has complied with the Olympic Charter and all applicable laws and regulations during the year.

For a more comprehensive review of the Federation's activities during the year, please refer to the message from the President and the closing remarks from the Hon. Secretary General in the Annual Report 2022-23.

Management contracts

No contracts concerning the management and administration of the whole or any substantial part of the business of the Federation were entered into or existed during the year.

Equity-linked agreements

The Federation never enter into any equity-link agreements at anytime during the year.

Permitted indemnity provisions

No permitted indemnity provision was in force during the year or is in force at the date of this report, for the benefit of a then director or a director of the Federation (whether made by the Federation or otherwise).

Auditor

A resolution will be submitted to the annual general meeting to re-appoint Mazars CPA Limited, *Certified Public Accountants*, as auditor of the Federation.

General Fund

This Fund is for the general administration and operation of the Federation.

Athletes Fund

This Fund is for the support to athletes and the development of athletes retirement scheme (HKACEP) in Hong Kong.

Investment Fund

This Fund is through investment in the financial assets, for the safeguard of the Federation's assets.

Investment Revaluation Reserve Fund

The Investment Revaluation Reserve Fund has been set up and is dealt with in accordance with the accounting policies adopted for revaluation of financial assets at FVOCI.

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

Sports Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China (the "Federation") is incorporated in Hong Kong with liability limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. The Federation's registered office is located at 2/F, Olympic House, 1 Stadium Path, So Kon Po, Hong Kong.

Every member of the Federation undertakes that if the Federation is wound up while he/she is a member, or within one year after he/she ceases to be a member, to contribute to the assets of the Federation an amount not exceeding HK\$100.

The principal activities of the Federation are development and promotion of sports in Hong Kong.

2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRSs"), which is a collective term includes all applicable individual Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards, Hong Kong Accounting Standards ("HKASs") and Interpretations issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (the "HKICPA"), accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the Companies Ordinance.

These financial statements have been prepared on a basis consistent with the accounting policies adopted in the 2022 financial statements. The new / revised HKFRSs that are relevant to the Federation and effective from the current year had no significant effects on the results and financial position of the Federation for the current and prior period. A summary of the principal accounting policies adopted by the Federation is set out below.

Basis of measurement

The measurement basis used in the preparation of the financial statements is historical cost, except for Designated FVOCI and financial assets at FVPL, which are measured at fair value as explained in the accounting policies set out below.

Discontinued operation

A discontinued operation is a component of the Federation that comprises operations and cash flows that can be clearly distinguished, operationally and for financial reporting purposes, from the rest of the Federation. It represents a separate major line of business to dispose of a separate major line of business. Classification as a discontinued operation occurs upon disposal or when the operation meets the criteria to be classified as held for sale, if earlier. It also occurs when the operation is abandoned.

Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use. Repairs and maintenance are charged to profit or loss during the year in which they are incurred.

2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Property, plant and equipment (Continued)

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost less accumulated impairment losses of property, plant and equipment over their estimated useful lives from the date on which they are available for use and after taking into account their estimated residual values, using the straight-line method at the rates as set out below. Where parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, the cost or valuation of the item is allocated on a reasonable basis and depreciated separately:

Furniture and fixtures	15%
Leasehold improvement	50%
Machinery and equipment	20%
Motor vehicles	20%

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected to arise from the continued use of the asset. Any gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the item) is included in profit or loss in the year in which the item is derecognised.

Impairment of non-financial assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Federation reviews internal and external sources of information to assess whether there is any indication that its property, plant and equipment and right-of-use assets may be impaired or impairment loss previously recognised no longer exists or may be reduced. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated, based on the higher of its fair value less costs of disposal and value in use. Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the Federation estimates the recoverable amount of the smallest group of assets that generates cash flows independently (i.e. a cash-generating unit).

If the recoverable amount of an asset or a cash-generating unit is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset or cash-generating unit is reduced to its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised as an expense immediately.

A reversal of impairment loss is limited to the carrying amount of the asset or cash-generating unit that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised in prior years. Reversal of impairment loss is recognised as income in profit or loss immediately.

Financial instruments

Financial assets

Recognition and derecognition

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when and only when the Federation becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instruments and on a trade date basis.

A financial asset is derecognised when and only when (i) the Federation's contractual rights to future cash flows from the financial asset expire or (ii) the Federation transfers the financial asset and either (a) the Federation transfers substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset, or (b) the Federation neither transfers nor retains substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset but it does not retain control of the financial asset.

2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Financial instruments (Continued) Financial assets (Continued)

Classification and measurement

Financial assets (except for trade receivables without a significant financing component) are initially recognised at their fair value plus, in the case of financial assets not carried at FVPL, transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition of the financial assets. Such trade receivables are initially measured at their transaction price.

On initial recognition, a financial asset is classified as (i) measured at amortised cost; (ii) debt investment measured at fair value through other comprehensive income ("Mandatory FVOCI"); (iii) equity investment measured at fair value through other comprehensive income ("Designated FVOCI"); or (iv) measured at fair value through profit or loss ("FVPL").

The classification of financial assets at initial recognition depends on the Federation's business model for managing the financial assets and the financial asset's contractual cash flow characteristics. Financial assets are not reclassified subsequent to their initial recognition unless the Federation changes its business model for managing them, in which case all affected financial assets are reclassified on the first day of the first annual reporting year following the change in the business model (the "reclassification date").

1) Financial assets measured at amortised cost

A financial asset is measured at amortised cost if it meets both of the following conditions and is not designated as at FVPL:

- it is held within a business model whose objective is to hold financial assets in order to collect contractual cash flows; and
- (ii) its contractual terms give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

Financial assets at amortised cost are subsequently measured using the effective interest rate method and are subject to impairment. Gains and losses arising from impairment, derecognition or through the amortisation process are recognised in profit or loss.

The Federation's financial assets at amortised cost include receivables, deposits and prepayments, amount due from a related company and bank balances and cash.

2) Designated FVOCI

Upon initial recognition, the Federation may make an irrevocable election to present subsequent changes in the fair value of an investment in an equity instrument that is neither held for trading nor contingent consideration recognised by an acquirer in a business combination to which HKFRS 3 "Business Combinations" applies in other comprehensive income. The classification is determined on an instrument-by-instrument basis.

These equity investments are subsequently measured at fair value and are not subject to impairment. Dividends are recognised in profit or loss unless the dividend clearly represents a recovery of part of the cost of the investment. Other gains or losses are recognised in other comprehensive income and shall not be subsequently reclassified to profit or loss. Upon derecognition, the cumulative gain or loss is transferred directly to accumulated profits or losses.

The Federation's financial assets at Designated FVOCI include listed equity securities.

3) Financial assets at FVPL

These investments include financial assets that are not measured at amortised cost or FVOCI, including financial assets held for trading, financial assets designated upon initial recognition as at FVPL, financial assets resulting from a contingent consideration arrangement in a business combination to which HKFRS 3 applies and financial assets that are otherwise required to be measured at FVPL. They are carried at fair value, with any resultant gain and loss recognised in profit or loss, which does not include any dividend or interest earned on the financial assets.

A financial asset is classified as held for trading if it is:

- (i) acquired principally for the purpose of selling it in the near term;
- (ii) part of a portfolio of identified financial instruments that are managed together and for which there is evidence of a recent actual pattern of short-term profit-taking on initial recognition; or
- (iii) a derivative that is not a financial guarantee contract or not a designated and effective hedging instrument.

Financial assets are designated at initial recognition as at FVPL only if doing so eliminates or significantly reduces a measurement or recognition inconsistency that would otherwise arise from measuring assets or liabilities or recognising the gains or losses on them on different bases.

The Federation's financial assets at FVPL include multi-assets funds.

Financial liabilities

Recognition and derecognition

Financial liabilities are recognised when and only when the Federation becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instruments.

A financial liability is derecognised when and only when the liability is extinguished, that is, when the obligation specified in the relevant contract is discharged, cancelled or expires.

Classification and measurement

Financial liabilities are initially recognised at their fair value plus, in the case of financial liabilities not carried at FVPL, transaction costs that are directly attributable to the issue of the financial liabilities.

The Federation's financial liabilities include account payables and accruals, advance subvention and sponsorship, amount due to a related company and deposit received. All financial liabilities are recognised initially at their fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost, using the effective interest method, unless the effect of discounting would be insignificant, in which case they are stated at cost.

Impairment of financial assets

The Federation recognises loss allowances for expected credit losses ("ECL") on financial assets that are measured at amortised cost to which the impairment requirements apply in accordance with HKFRS 9 "Financial Instruments". Except for the specific treatments as detailed below, at each reporting date, the Federation measures a loss allowance for a financial asset at an amount equal to the lifetime ECL if the credit risk on that financial asset has increased significantly since initial recognition. If the credit risk on a financial asset has not increased significantly since initial recognition, the Federation measures the loss allowance for that financial asset at an amount equal to 12-month ECL.

Measurement of ECL

ECL is a probability-weighted estimate of credit losses (i.e. the present value of all cash shortfalls) over the expected life of the financial instrument.

For financial assets, a credit loss is the present value of the difference between the contractual cash flows that are due to an entity under the contract and the cash flows that the entity expects to receive.

Lifetime ECL represents the ECL that will result from all possible default events over the expected life of a financial instrument while 12-month ECL represents the portion of lifetime ECL that is expected to result from default events on a financial instrument that are possible within 12 months after the reporting date.

Loss allowance is remeasured at each reporting date to reflect changes in the financial instrument's credit risk and loss since initial recognition. The resulting changes in the loss allowance are recognised as an impairment gain or loss in profit or loss with a corresponding adjustment to the carrying amount of the financial instrument.

Definition of default

The Federation considers the following as constituting an event of default for internal credit risk management purposes as historical experience indicates that the Federation may not receive the outstanding contractual amounts in full if the financial instrument that meets any of the following criteria.

- (i) information developed internally or obtained from external sources indicates that the debtor is unlikely to pay its creditors, including the Federation, in full (without taking into account any collaterals held by the Federation); or
- (ii) there is a breach of financial covenants by the counterparty.

Assessment of significant increase in credit risk

In assessing whether the credit risk on a financial instrument has increased significantly since initial recognition, the Federation compares the risk of a default occurring on the financial instrument as at the reporting date with the risk of a default occurring on the financial instrument as at the date of initial recognition. In making this assessment, the Federation considers both quantitative and qualitative information that is reasonable and supportable, including historical experience and forward-looking information that is available without undue cost or effort. In particular, the following information is taken into account in the assessment:

- the debtor's failure to make payments of principal or interest on the due dates;
- an actual or expected significant deterioration in the financial instrument's external or internal credit rating (if available);
- an actual or expected significant deterioration in the operating results of the debtor; and
- actual or expected changes in the technological, market, economic or legal environment that
 have or may have a significant adverse effect on the debtor's ability to meet its obligation to
 the Federation.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Federation assumes that the credit risk on a financial instrument has not increased significantly since initial recognition if the financial instrument is determined to have low credit risk at the reporting date.

Low credit risk

Per HKFRS 9, a financial instrument is determined to have low credit risk if:

- it has a low risk of default;
- (ii) the borrower has a strong capacity to meet its contractual cash flow obligations in the near term; and
- (iii) adverse changes in economic and business conditions in the longer term may, but will not necessarily, reduce the ability of the borrower to fulfil its contractual cash flow obligations.

Credit-impaired financial asset

A financial asset is credit-impaired when one or more events that have a detrimental impact on the estimated future cash flows of that financial asset have occurred. Evidence that a financial asset is credit-impaired include observable data about the following events:

- (a) significant financial difficulty of the issuer or the borrower.
- (b) a breach of contract, such as a default or past due event.
- (c) the lender(s) of the borrower, for economic or contractual reasons relating to the borrower's financial difficulty, having granted to the borrower a concession(s) that the lender(s) would not otherwise consider.
- (d) it is becoming probable that the borrower will enter bankruptcy or other financial reorganisation.
- (e) the disappearance of an active market for that financial asset because of financial difficulties.
- (f) the purchase or origination of a financial asset at a deep discount that reflects the incurred credit losses.

Write-off

The Federation writes off a financial asset when the Federation has no reasonable expectations of recovering the contractual cash flows on a financial asset in its entirety or a portion thereof. However, financial assets that are written off could still be subject to enforcement activities under the Federation's procedures for recovery of amounts due, taking into account legal advice if appropriate. Any subsequent recovery is recognised in profit or loss.

Leases

The Federation assesses whether a contract is, or contains, a lease at inception of the contract. A contract is, or contains, a lease if the contract conveys the right to control the use of an identified asset for a period of time in exchange for consideration.

As lessee

The Federation applies the recognition exemption to short-term leases and low-value asset leases. Lease payments associated with these leases are recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

The Federation has elected not to separate non-lease components from lease components, and accounts for each lease component and any associated non-lease components as a single lease component.

The Federation accounts for each lease component within a lease contract as a lease separately. The Federation allocates the consideration in the contract to each lease component on the basis of the relative stand-alone price of the lease component.

Leases (Continued)

As lessee (Continued)

Amounts payable by the Federation that do not give rise to a separate component are considered to be part of the total consideration that is allocated to the separately identified components of the contract.

The Federation recognises a right-of-use asset and a lease liability at the commencement date of the lease.

The right-of-use asset is initially measured at cost, which comprises

- (a) the amount of the initial measurement of the lease liability;
- (b) any lease payments made at or before the commencement date, less any lease incentives received;
- (c) any initial direct costs incurred by the Federation; and
- (d) an estimate of costs to be incurred by the Federation in dismantling and removing the underlying asset, restoring the site on which it is located or restoring the underlying asset to the condition required by the terms and conditions of the lease, unless those costs are incurred to produce inventories.

Subsequently, the right-of-use asset is measured at cost less any accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses and adjusted for any remeasurement of the lease liability. Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis over the shorter of the lease term and the estimated useful lives of the right-of-use asset as follows:

Office premises

Over the term of lease

The lease liability is initially measured at the present value of the lease payments that are not paid at the commencement date of the contract.

The lease payments included in the measurement of the lease liability comprise the following payments for the right to use the underlying asset during the lease term that are not paid at the commencement date:

- (a) fixed payments (including in-substance fixed payments), less any lease incentives receivable; and
- (b) payments of penalties for terminating the lease, if the lease term reflects the Federation exercising an option to terminate the lease.

The lease payments are discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease, or where it is not readily determinable, the incremental borrowing rate of the lessee.

Subsequently, the lease liability is measured by increasing the carrying amount to reflect interest on the lease liability and by reducing the carrying amount to reflect the lease payments made.

Cash equivalents

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash equivalents represent short-term highly liquid investments which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash with maturity less than 3 months and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value, net of bank overdrafts. For classification in the statement of financial position, cash equivalents represent assets similar in nature to cash and which are not restricted as to use.

Revenue recognition

Subvention and programme income

Subvention and programme income, including sponsorship income are recognised when the Federation's rights to receive payment have been established and the conditions have been fulfilled.

Dividend income

Dividend income from financial assets is recognised when the Federation's rights to receive dividend is established, provided that it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the dividend will flow to the Federation and the amount of the dividend can be measured reliably.

Revenue from contracts with customers within HKFRS 15

The nature of the goods or services provided by the Federation is as follows:

Service A: Drug test service under discontinued operation.

Service B: Entry fees for Olympic events and income from officers and members.

Service C: Licensing income.

Services A and B

Identification of performance obligations

At contract inception, the Federation assesses the goods or services promised in a contract with a customer and identifies as a performance obligation each promise to transfer to the customer either:

- (a) a good or service (or a bundle of goods or services) that is distinct; or
- (b) a series of distinct goods or services that are substantially the same and that have the same pattern of transfer to the customer.

A good or service that is promised to a customer is distinct if both of the following criteria are met:

- (a) the customer can benefit from the good or service either on its own or together with other resources that are readily available to the customer (i.e. the good or service is capable of being distinct); and
- (b) the Federation's promise to transfer the good or service to the customer is separately identifiable from other promises in the contract (i.e. the promise to transfer the good or service is distinct within the context of the contract).

Timing of revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised when (or as) the Federation satisfies a performance obligation by transferring a promised good or service (i.e. an asset) to a customer. An asset is transferred when (or as) the customer obtains control of that asset.

The Federation transfers control of a good or service over time and, therefore, satisfies a performance obligation and recognises revenue over time, if one of the following criteria is met:

- (a) the customer simultaneously receives and consumes the benefits provided by the Federation's performance as the Federation performs;
- (b) the Federation's performance creates or enhances an asset (for example, work in progress) that the customer controls as the asset is created or enhanced; or
- (c) the Federation's performance does not create an asset with an alternative use to the Federation and the Federation has an enforceable right to payment for performance completed to date.

Timing of revenue recognition (Continued)

If a performance obligation is not satisfied over time, the Federation satisfies the performance obligation at a point in time when the customer obtains control of the promised asset. In determining when the transfer of control occurs, the Federation considers the concept of control and such indicators as legal title, physical possession, right to payment, significant risks and rewards of ownership of the asset, and customer acceptance.

Drug Test service is recognised at a point in time when the testing report is issued.

Entry fees for Olympic events and Events income from officers and members are recognised at a point in time when the events conducted successfully for participants.

Service C

Licensing income

The Federation has entered into a number of agreements with licensees under which the Federation grants the licensees rights to use the Federation's intellectual property (being the Olympic emblem of the Federation). In return, the Federation is entitled to fixed annual payments, which are stated in the agreements.

HKFRS 15 requires an entity to determine whether an entity's promise to grant a license is a right to access the entity's intellectual property (with consideration being recognised as revenue over time) or a right to use the entity's intellectual property (with consideration being recognised as revenue at a particular point in time). Based on the specific requirements under HKFRS 15, an entity's promise to grant a license is a right to access the entity's intellectual property when all of the following criteria are met:

- the contract requires, or the customer reasonably expects, that the entity will undertake
 activities that significantly affect the intellectual property to which the customer has rights;
- (b) the rights granted by the licence directly expose the customer to any positive or negative effects of the entity's activities identified in (a) above; and
- (c) those activities do not result in the transfer of a good or a service to the customer as those activities occur.

Having assessed the terms of the related agreements and the specific facts and circumstances, the directors concluded that all of the abovementioned criteria are satisfied and concluded that the licensing income should be recognised over time.

Interest income

Interest income from financial assets is recognised using the effective interest method. For financial assets measured at amortised cost that are not credit-impaired, the effective interest rate is applied to the gross carrying amount of the assets while it is applied to the amortised cost (i.e. the gross carrying amount net of loss allowance) in case of credit-impaired financial assets.

2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Contract assets

If the Federation grants the license to a customer before the customer pays consideration or before payment is due, the contract is presented as a contract asset, excluding any amounts presented as a receivable. A receivable is the Federation's right to consideration that is unconditional or only the passage of time is required before payment of that consideration is due.

For the business of Service C, in accordance with the standard payment schedules of the Federation, payments are normally not due or received. However, for such transactions, revenue is recognised over time and therefore, a contract asset is recognised until it becomes a receivable or payments are received. During that period, any significant financing components, if applicable, will be included in the contract asset and recognised as interest income.

Employee benefits

Short term employee benefits

Salaries, annual bonuses, paid annual leave, contributions to defined contribution retirement plans and gratuity are accrued in the period in which the associated services are rendered by employees. Where payment or settlement is deferred and the effect would be material, these amounts are stated at their present values.

Defined contribution plans

The obligations for contributions to defined contribution retirement scheme are recognised as an expense in profit or loss as incurred. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the Federation in an independently administered fund.

Government grants

Government grants are recognised at their fair value where there is reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attaching conditions will be complied with. When the grant relates to an expense item, it is recognised as income over the years necessary to match the grant on a systematic basis to the costs that it is intended to compensate. Where the grant relates to an asset, the fair value is credited to a deferred income account and is released to profit or loss over the expected useful life of the relevant asset to match the depreciation charge.

Foreign currency translation

The financial statements are presented in the currency of Hong Kong dollars, which is the Federation's functional and presentation currency.

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation at year-end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in profit or loss.

2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Taxation

The charge for current income tax is based on the results for the year as adjusted for items that are non-assessable or disallowed. It is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax is provided, using the liability method, on all temporary differences at the end of the reporting period between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. However, any deferred tax arising from initial recognition of goodwill; or other asset or liability in a transaction other than a business combination that at the time of the transaction affects neither the accounting profit nor taxable profit or loss is not recognised.

The deferred tax liabilities and assets are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the year when the asset is recovered or the liability is settled, based on tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary differences, tax losses and credits can be utilised.

Related parties

A related party is a person or entity that is related to the Federation.

- (a) A person or a close member of that person's family is related to the Federation if that person:
 - (i) has control or joint control over the Federation;
 - (ii) has significant influence over the Federation; or
 - (iii) is a member of the key management personnel of the Federation.
- (b) An entity is related to the Federation if any of the following conditions applies:
 - (i) one entity is a subsidiary, an associate or joint venture of the other entity.
 - (ii) the entity is a post-employment benefit plan for the benefit of employees of either the Federation or an entity related to the Federation.
 - (iii) the entity is controlled or jointly controlled by a person identified in (a).
 - (iv) a person identified in (a)(i) has significant influence over the entity or is a member of the key management personnel of the entity.
 - (v) the entity, or any member of a group of which it is a part, provides key management personnel services to the Federation.

Close members of the family of a person are those family members who may be expected to influence, or be influenced by, that person in their dealings with the entity and include:

- (a) that person's children and spouse or domestic partner;
- (b) children of that person's spouse or domestic partner; and
- (c) dependants of that person or that person's spouse or domestic partner.

In the definition of a related party, an associate includes subsidiaries of the associate and a joint venture includes subsidiaries of the joint venture.

Critical accounting estimates and judgements

Estimates and assumptions concerning the future and judgements are made by the management in the preparation of the financial statements. They affect the application of the Federation's accounting policies, reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses, and disclosures made. They are assessed on an on-going basis and are based on experience and relevant factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. Where appropriate, revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period of revision and future periods, in case the revision also affects future periods.

Key sources of estimation uncertainty

Loss allowance for ECL

The Federation's management estimates the loss allowance for amount due from related companies and contract assets by using various inputs and assumptions including risk of a default and expected loss rate. The estimation involves high degree of uncertainty which is based on the Federation's historical information, existing market conditions as well as forward-looking estimates at the end of each reporting period. Where the expectation is different from the original estimate, such difference will impact the carrying amount of for amount due from related companies and contract assets. Details of the key assumption and inputs used in estimating ECL are set out in note 27 to the financial statements.

Future changes in HKFRSs

At the date of authorisation of these financial statements, the HKICPA has issued a number of new / revised HKFRSs that are not yet effective for the current year, which the Federation has not early adopted. The directors do not anticipate that the adoption of the new / revised HKFRSs in future periods will have any material impact on the results of the Federation.

23. DISCONTINUED OPERATIONS

With the support from the Government, the Anti-Doping Organization of Hong Kong, China Limited (the "ADOHK") was incorporated to take up all the business, assets and liabilities of the Hong Kong Anti-Doping Committee (the "HKADC") from the Federation on 1 April 2023. Thus, the Federation ceased to have its control over the HKADC by 1 April 2023 and therefore the carrying amount related to the assets and liabilities of HKADC were transferred to ADOHK on 1 April 2023. 27. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The main purpose of these financial instruments is to raise and maintain finance for the Federation's operations. The Board of directors considers that the Federation's exposures to interest rate risk were insignificant at the end of the reporting period, as there were no interest-bearing borrowing and the impact on interest rate changes of bank deposits were not significant. As a result, the main risks associated with these financial assets and financial liabilities are price risk, credit risk and liquidity risk. The Federation does not have written risk management policies and guidelines. However, the Board of directors generally adopts conservative strategies on its risk management and limits the Federation's exposure to these risks to a minimum.

27. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES (CONTINUED)

The Federation's Designated FVOCI are measured at fair value at the end of each reporting period with reference to the quoted price. Therefore, the Federation is exposed to price risk and the management monitors the price movements and takes appropriate actions when required.

At the end of the reporting period, if the equity price to the valuation model had been 10% (2022: 10%) higher / lower while all other variables were held constant, the Federation's net surplus / deficit would have been unaffected since all the equity investments are classified as Designated FVOCI. Investment Revaluation Reserve Fund (non-recycling) deficit would be decreased / increased by HK\$1.93 million (2022: HK\$2.08 million) as a result of changes in fair value of Designated FVOCI.

In addition, the Federation's financial assets at FVPL are measured at fair value at the end of each reporting period with reference to the quoted price. Therefore, the Federation is also exposed to price risk in this respect.

Credit risk

The credit risk of the Federation is primarily attributable to financial assets at FVPL, receivables, deposits, contract assets, amounts due from related companies and bank balances and time deposits.

The carrying amount of financial assets recognised on the statement of financial position represents the Federation's exposure to credit risk without taking into account the value of any collateral held or other credit enhancements.

Financial assets at FVPL

The Federation invests only in securities with good credit rating counterparties, as such the risk of default is also considered minimal.

Receivables, deposits, contract assets and amounts due from related companies

The Federation considers that the receivables, deposits, contract assets and amounts due from related companies have low credit risk based on the counterparties' strong capacity to meet its contractual cash flow obligations in the near term and low risk of default. Impairment on receivables measured on 12-month ECL and reflects the short maturities of the exposures.

In estimating the ECL of receivables, deposits, contract assets and amounts due from related companies, the Federation has taken into account the historical actual credit loss experience over the past years and the financial position of the counterparties, adjusted for forward-looking factors that are specific to the debtors and general economic conditions of the industry in which the counterparties operate, in estimating the probability of default of these financial assets, as well as the loss upon default in each case. The management of the Federation considers the ECL of these financial assets to be insignificant after taking into account the financial position and credit quality of the counterparties. There was no change in the estimation techniques or significant assumptions made during the year.

Bank balances and time deposits

The Federation considers that the exposure to credit risk arising from bank balances and time deposits is limited because the counterparties are banks with sound credit rating, for which the Federation considers to have low credit risk.

Liquidity risk

The Federation's policy is to regularly monitor current and expected liquidity requirements to ensure that the Federation maintains sufficient reserves of cash and cash equivalents to meet its liquidity requirements in the short and longer term. The Federation's financial liabilities at the end of reporting period based on contractual undiscounted cash flow are all due for payment within one year or on demand.

Fair value measurements

The carrying value of financial instruments are measured at fair value at 31 March 2023 across the three levels of the fair value hierarchy defined in HKFRS 13, *Fair Value Measurement*, with the fair value measurement categorised in its entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the entire measurement. The levels are defined as follows:

- Level 1 (highest level): quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that the Federation can access at the measurement date;
- Level 2: inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly; and
- Level 3 (lowest level): unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

The fair value of all the Federation's Designated FVOCI and financial assets at FVPL are measured based on Level 1 inputs. During the year ended 31 March 2023, there were no transfers between Level 1 and Level 2 fair value measurements, and no transfers into and out of Level 3 fair value measurements.

28. CAPITAL MANAGEMENT

The objectives of the Federation's capital management are to safeguard its ability to continue as a going concern for its development and promotion of sports objectives. The Federation manages its cumulated funds available and makes adjustments to these funds in light of changes in economic conditions and business strategies. To manage the funds, the Federation may adjust the use of its reserve or raise fund and repay debts.
